

Structure, Governance and Management

For the reporting period 1st October, 2020 to 30th September, 2021 the club was recognised as Edinburgh Athletic SCIO (SC048693). The constitution as amended at the 2020 AGM remains the governing document of the charity.



It was agreed last year that it would best serve the needs of the club, if the onus to meet regularly fell on the shoulders of the trustees, during the challenging Covid period and this continued during the reporting period. Full minutes of both trustees and management committee meetings have been taken and circulated as appropriate.

Appointment of Trustees

Trustees are elected annually at the club's Annual General Meeting and are required to sign a Declaration Form stating they are not debarred from holding such a position. They are appointed

for one year but are eligible for re-election. It was identified as a priority on our business plan that we should increase the number of trustees from the required minimum of 6 and it is pleasing to report that we now have 7 trustees. We are cognisant of the fact that it would be in the Charity's best interests to increase this number further to 8.

Management

The Board of Trustees meet regularly to review the strategic development and financial wellbeing of the club. They also attend the regular Management Committee meetings which consist of the Sub-Group leaders, who are mandated to carry out 'hands on' leadership and management of the individual sub-groups. Each Sub-Group has clearly defined roles and these along with other Supporting Roles ensure that all areas of the club have representation in the management of the club. During the COVID crisis, the trustees have increased the regularity of their meetings and the constitution was amended to allow meetings and AGMs to be conducted virtually. The Charity has constituted a Covid subgroup and appointed a Covid officer, as required by Scottish Athletics. Protocols are in place to ensure full compliance with current Covid guidelines and club activities, including club championships and inter club competitions were able to resume.

Objective and Activities

The club operates as a non-profit distributing charity whose principal objective is to promote interest in, and the advancement of public participation in the sport of Athletics. This is facilitated

by providing coaching, facilities, and opportunities for anyone in the community aged nine years or upwards to participate in athletics. The club offers coaching and training in all disciplines of athletics to over two hundred children aged nine to seventeen and over two hundred and fifty adults. With the continued closure of Meadowbank, the club has continued to operate out of several venues across the city of Edinburgh to maintain the focus on the provision of opportunities to participate in athletics. It was challenging to maintain club cohesion during lockdown, having forced the club into a period of inactivity but when full training was able to resume the club were able to reinstate club training nights at Saughton, where they leased the track on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday evenings. The club have taken the initiative in working with Edinburgh Leisure and the other user clubs at Saughton, to upgrade the existing facilities including the track, high jump, long jump, shot



and javelin which have been successfully granted Permit 2 status for any future competitions held at the venue. It is a fitting legacy to leave for the time the club has spent, operating out of Saughton, and will benefit the whole athletic community in the city. In addition to making use of the green spaces around Edinburgh the club also leased Meadowmill in East Lothian and event



specific sessions were offered on a Saturday morning, in the period before the facilities at Saughton were upgraded. In May, Covid-19 compliant 'face to face' athletics competition was re-introduced to members under the watchful eyes of our club officials and volunteers. Athletes relished in the opportunity to participate in the in-house 'Together Apart Series' of track & field events at Saughton.

The number of active members has continued to decrease this year and the cancellation of school events at local and

national level impacted on recruitment. The club encouraged athletes to participate in the "virtual" activities offered by Scottish Athletics and the endurance section of the club were very proactive in promoting their own "virtual" events, which were very well supported. All sessions comply strictly with Covid protocols, regarding track and trace, risk assessments and health and safety. Although the very successful "Winning Cadets" programme came to an end the club has secured further sponsorship to support the continuation of this programme when the club relocates back to Meadowbank. Key to the club's strategy is the provision of opportunities for all to compete in all disciplines of athletics, including track and field, cross country, road, and hill racing at a local level through to national and international level. All the club's training and competition opportunities are made possible by the continued enthusiasm, commitment, and dedication of over sixty-five volunteer club members. They deliver the coaching, provide club management, team management, ensure good communication by means of a club website and other social platforms, and officiate at events. They are ably supported by willing parent helpers. The club currently has no paid positions within the club structure.

Achievements & Performance

Edinburgh AC has long been recognised internationally as a club, with a history of nurturing future international stars at the iconic Meadowbank. This reputation was further enhanced when the 2021 1500M EAC Club Championships was watched by millions of viewers in Tokyo where one of our club members got the best of his club mate, to win a fantastic bronze medal. It is not only on the global stage at senior level that the name EAC is synonymous with success and this year has been a good one with representation in GB



teams at Senior, U20 and U18 level, championship success at UK, Senior level, medallists in the England U23 and U20 championships and multiple medal winners at Scottish Senior and age group championships. The 2021 role of Honour will acknowledge the achievements of these athletes and their coaches.

<u>Bert Farmer Legacy</u>* - Prior to our current SCIO Charity status being granted, the club was bequeathed the sum of £132,000 from the estate of the former long standing club Bert Farmer. On the amalgamation of the former City of Edinburgh Athletic and Edinburgh Southern Harriers in 1987, to form the current Edinburgh Athletic Club, all assets including those associated with Bert Farmer were transferred into a single bank account. At the meeting of the Trustees on 21st Jul 2021 it was agreed to re-constitute the Bert Farmer Legacy Fund and the monies to be restricted for use as determined by the Trustees. It is intended to open a separate new bank / savings account into which the monies will be transferred.

<u>Tilly Loss Fund</u>** - a Grant of £5,200 from the Tilly Loss Trust to be utilised for Coaches and Officials CPD and supporting EAC Winning Cadets programme over a period of three years 2020-23.

Edinburgh Athletic Club has no other Investments, Assets or Liabilities.
